

## Southwest Children's Literature Web Site Checklist/Rubric Assessment

The total number of points possible for this learning experience is: **50 points**.

The **online conversation** is worth **25 points**:

- 5 points for initiating a discussion with students
- 5 points for responding to students on class-level, general topics
- 15 points for posting responses to student work related to individual novel

Responses include questions for students

Responses are composed with student-friendly language

Responses are an appropriate length for student readers

The **booktalk/book review** is worth **15 points**:

- 5 points for a hook and a summary of the book.
- 5 points for curricular connections
- 5 points for evaluation (that speaks to classroom teachers)

The **autobiography** is worth **5 points**:

- 5 points for contributing a paragraph to the "About the Reviewers" page

The **email self-reflection** (individual) is worth **5 points**. The course facilitator will email these questions to you. The reflection is due within one week after your novel group completes its work. Use these focusing questions to guide your personal reflection:

- What was most surprising to you as you engaged in literature discussions in the online environment?
- What was the most unusual conversation you engaged in during the online discussions?
- What did you learn that will be useful to you in teaching, in reader's advisory, or in writing for young adults?
- What is your opinion about integrating technology into the literature curriculum?
- Describe your contribution to the project and your experience of the partnership with your UA colleagues.
